

Duty Roster Roles

A good duty roster will assign equal work for everyone. It will help maintain order and everyone will know their assigned duties and not have to worry that they are doing more than their share. Everyone will be assured the opportunity to be an active member of their patrol.

• Cooking

- prepare and serve the meal ON TIME
- put away extra food and put trash from the food preparation in the trash
- dump hot grease before they eat
- assure everyone receives an equal portion, the cooks serve themselves last
- CLEAN AS YOU GO

• Clean up

- put wash and rinse water on to heat up during the meal
- wash the dishes
- wipe down the stove, tables, and food preparation area;
- put away the clean dishes
- dump dirty dish water (if needed) in sump
- hang dish cloths so they can dry and secure the dinning area.
- no dirty dishes are to be left and all food is to be put away.

• Fire

- ensures a good fire for the cooks
- if stoves are being used, set up and fuel stoves
- manages wood/charcoal
- starts and tends campfire

• Water

- get sufficient water for next meal including drinking, cooking and cleanup water
- available during the meal in case cooks need more water
- water needs be filtered or treated in time to be used for the meal

• Patrol Box

- Setup and inspection, all gear accounted for
- Ensure clean and organized
- Notes any replenishment items

• All Scouts

- pick up trash in camp; straighten up personal gear; check condition of tent.
- area is secured for expected weather conditions.
- remember more hands will make the work easier.
- you are not ready, if your patrol is not ready.
- the Troop is not ready, unless all Patrols are ready.
- when the Troop is ready, then you are ready.
